About the Program

Currently, there are few forums for in-depth discussions on data sharing. While challenges such as consent, governance, incentives, and authorship have been explored in academic papers and webinars, there has been limited opportunity to define how proposed solutions can be implemented, especially in low-resource settings.

Objectives

- To discuss practical and technological solutions to enhance accessibility, security and interoperability of health data.
- To explore ethical, legal, and governance approaches in data sharing.
- To review research findings and develop a research agenda for data sharing and reuse.

Scope & Participants

The workshop is discussion based, and will focus on health-related data, including research and real-world data, primarily collected in low-resource healthcare settings, though not limited to these areas.

Participants in this workshop will consist of 20-25 data managers, researchers, funders and policy experts actively working on ethical, governance and technological solutions for health data sharing and reuse. While we recognize that it is unavoidable to talk about challenges, the main aim of this workshop is to advance solutions.
